## **Erie Canal: The Longest Ditch in History**

It was the engineering marvel of its time - its construction has been compared to the building of the pyramids of Ancient Egypt. The idea for a canal connecting the Hudson River and the Great Lakes was President declared by Thomas Jefferson to be a "little short of madness". However, DeWitt Clinton, Governor of New York, was a huge supporter of the idea. As governor, he pushed through legislation to fund the construction of the canal - Clinton's "Big Ditch" (or as Clinton's opponents would call it, "Clinton's Folly") was born. The massive job was begun in 1817 and completed in 1825.
